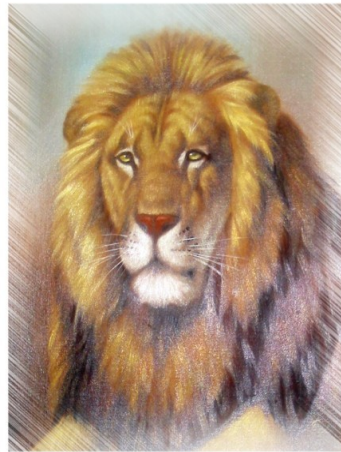

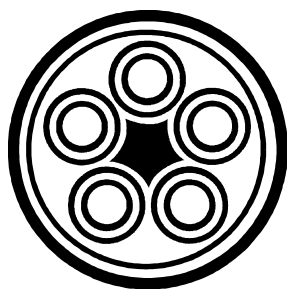

Academically

An emphasis upon academic achievement is the first element in this dynamic balance. Students learn from Christian teachers who challenge them to be their best. On the Stanford Achievement Tests, Christian school students consistently score one year ahead of the national norms.

Socially

Positive peers and family involvement best describe the second element of this special Warren County Christian School balance. Students are surrounded by positive role models who will influence the rest of their lives.

Physically

The third element, which describes this perfect balance, is physical development. Students need a break from their studies. At Warren County Christian School, we provide this for students. We offer physical education to both elementary and secondary students, as well as the opportunity to join one of our sports teams, or become one of our great “Lions” fans.

Emotionally

A fourth, and very important element, is the student’s emotional development. Students are surrounded by people who care for, nurture, and encourage them. Comments and behaviors which form healthy mental attitudes, are those which permeate our programs and daily campus activities.

Spiritually

The final and most important element in the balance found at Warren County Christian School is a commitment to Christ. Students are not only taught the values and principals as written in the Bible, but they are also challenged to reach beyond themselves into the community and world-wide missions, applying the knowledge they have gained. Our goal is that students help others achieve what they have been fortunate to obtain through their relationship with Jesus Christ.

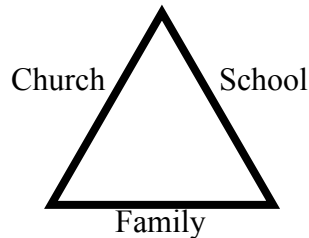
BUSING

Our Mission

Warren County Christian School's discipleship program is designed to stand with the church and the family to further promote and instill Godly virtue and Biblical world view in our students. We believe each element of this balance is vital to the overall success of our mission.



WCCS Mission Statement

To provide Biblically integrated instruction, experience, and Christian example to all students, so they will graduate with an academic foundation, God centered world view, Christian perspective, and strength of character essential to their pursuing a productive, mature, and godly life.

WCCS Statement of Faith

- ◆There is one God, eternally existing in three persons – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. (Mt. 28:19)
- ◆The Holy Scriptures are verbally inspired by God and are our only infallible rule of faith and practice. (Jn 1:1)
- ◆Jesus Christ died, shedding his blood for our sins, and was bodily raised from the dead, thereby breaking the bonds of death and assuring us of eternal life. (1 Cor. 15:14-18)
- ◆Jesus Christ will return visibly and bodily with power and great glory. (1Thes. 4:16)
- ◆Man is, by nature and practice, a sinner, separated from God and can become God's child only by personal faith in Jesus Christ, and as a result, live in submission to God's will as revealed in the scriptures. (Rom. 3:22-24)
- ◆Those who are born into God's family have eternal life (Jn. 3:16) and those who are not remain in spiritual death and will be separated from God forever in hell. (2Thes. 1:7-9)
- ◆The Holy Spirit lives in the believer, enabling him to walk in purity of life and submission to the will of God. (Rom. 8:13-14)
- ◆The believer, in response to his faith in and commitment to Christ, is an active part of the local body of Christ. (Eph. 4:1-16)

Non-Discriminatory Policy

STATEMENT OF FAITH

- * We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be verbally inspired by God and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are the supreme and final authority in faith and conduct.
- * We believe in one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His atonement for our sins by His blood, shed when He died for us, in His bodily resurrection, in His personal, bodily, visible, imminent return to earth to establish His Kingdom in power and glory.
- * We believe in the literal account of creation, and that the Scriptures clearly teach that man was created by a special, immediate, formative act of God, that Adam and Eve sinned, and thereby brought on themselves not only physical death - separation from God, and that all human beings are born with this sinful nature.
- * We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice; that He rose again for our justification, and that all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood, and are saved by grace through faith, wholly apart from human merit and works.
- * We believe in the bodily resurrection of the dead, the saved to a life of eternal glory in Heaven, and the unsaved to eternal damnation.
- * We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit, by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life.
- * We believe that the primary goal of every Christian is to glorify the name of Jesus Christ in all that we do; therefore, we should separate ourselves from all practices and influences which hinder a spirit-filled life.
- * We believe it is the privilege and the responsibility of every believer to do his or her utmost to give the Gospel of Christ to the whole world.
- * We believe that the true, universal Church includes all believers in Christ during this present age and is the body and bride of Christ of which He is the head.

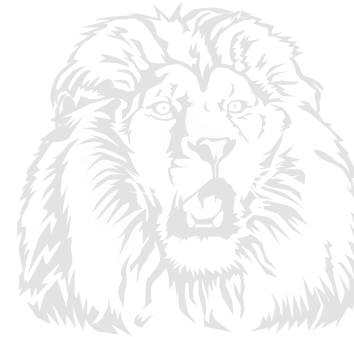

 - ◆ Reading the weekly communications from the school
 - ◆ Volunteering for such duties as lunch/recess, room parent, and driver/chaperone, when able
 - ◆ Making personal sacrifices of our time to help on school work days and special events
 - ◆ Helping in the school's fundraising, understanding that it helps keep our tuition costs down
- ◆ Consistently support your child's teacher(s) and privately contact the school if any situation of real concern arises, in accordance with the Matthew 18 principles.

- ◆ Guide our child by insuring that each child gets adequate rest, a nourishing diet, a place to study, and needed encouragement. We will monitor our child's progress, and do all that we can to insure our child's success.

Criteria for Acceptance

- Since Warren County Christian School (WCCS) considers itself to be an extension of the family and church, each student should be part of a Christian family with a clear testimony, who regularly attends a Biblical fellowship.
- The family's reasons for sending students to WCCS should be spiritual as well as academic.
- Students should be academically prepared to cope with the level of performance expected by the school.
- Family life should be wholesome and stable.
- The family should be in whole-hearted agreement with the school's standards and policies.
- Junior and senior high students should *want* to attend WCCS.
- Students should give evidence of being disciplined; and parents should support a disciplined environment.
- New families should be recommended by a WCCS family and/or a local pastor who is familiar with the policies and standards of the school.
