Wednesday Dress Code

This is just a reminder that your students need to be dressed appropriately for chapel. Please be advised that for both guys and gals dress pants/slacks are required!! Everyday school pants are not acceptable for Wednesdays. One exception to the list below is that Mr. K has already approved dress slacks for gals beginning in November. The following is an excerpt from the parent/student handbook that each family is required to read at the start of each school year:

Girl's Chapel Dress Day (Reserve clashing clothes for spirit week)

- Any modest dress, jumper, skirt, with dress top, no hoodies, sweatshirts or tee shirts (follow code **)
- -Nylons and dress flats or heels (grades 5-12) (no sneakers or flip flops)
- -Knee socks, tights, or anklets (K-4)
- -Dress slacks are allowed during the months of Dec. thru Feb.
- -Dress Gauchos are allowed

Boy's Chapel Dress (Reserve clashing clothing for Spirit Week)

- -Dress slacks or dress khakis, keep all pants at waist, no tattered leg bottoms
- -Tie *Must be pulled up and shirt collar buttoned at all times
- -Dress shoes (no sneakers) (socks should match slacks)
- -Dress shirts with collars; No hoodies, or sweatshirts

Basketball Photos

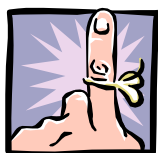

Lice Reminder

The latest reported case of lice was less than two weeks ago. As a school we need parents to do several things for us:

- 1) Please check your child's head regularly. Just because they didn't have lice yesterday doesn't mean they won't have it tomorrow. Please check every 1 – 2 weeks.
- 2) Please report it to the school. We will try to be discreet, but having lice is nothing to be ashamed of. It simply means that your child came into contact with another child who had lice. Other parents will be more diligent in checking their child's head if they know it is present.
- 3) If you treat your child for lice please re-treat them in about 10 days. It is nearly impossible to get every nit (egg) out of your child's hair so killing newly hatched lice will prevent them from starting the egg laying process all over again. Any child who has been treated for lice needs to be monitored *every day or two* for at least a month. Also, it has been reported that lice combs may be ineffective in removing nits. You may have to pick nits out strand by strand.

Please be diligent in helping us to combat lice.
